Dear SMASHing Families,

Every year we receive submissions from our SMASH alums now at Samohi seeking a \$250 scholarship for college. Six alums wrote about how they were influenced by their time at SMASH. I will share excerpts from all six over the next few Friday Letters.

Andrew C's submission:

"The most important way SMASH has influenced my life is by causing me to think creatively. I believe that one of the major attributes SMASH has is the ability to teach students in ways best suited for them...

To me, creativity is a way to express oneself without boundaries. A world without creativity would be very much like George Orwell's "1984," a dystopia in which no one diverges from the norm. Everyone would be the same. A memorable moment when I creatively expressed myself because of my experience at SMASH was in my 10th grade honors English class. Two classmates (who happen to also be SMASH alumni, Luca and Romeo) and I were assigned to create a project based on Shakespeare's "Macbeth." The project had to be about one of the major themes in the novel... I thought up and produced a rap battle video between characters Banquo and King Duncan...

My source of inspiration was my love for music. I've watched countless music videos, from simple homemade ones to million dollar projects, all of which inspired me in one way or another. The rap battle illustrated creativity because "Macbeth" had nothing to do with rap. It was my interpretation of the book through an original idea, and was only possible without boundaries. Having freedom is necessary for being creative, and I look forward to college for more opportunities to express my creativity.

Throughout this project, I saw how my time at SMASH has benefited me. With my creative thinking, I took a chance with a unique idea, and it turned out great. My musical life has also manifested the fruits of my creativity. When I joined band, I was placed in Concert Band 1. Despite not being very musically talented, I started incorporating creative elements into my practice. I emphasized accents, tempo, and dynamics in all my rehearsals and solos. Ultimately, I nailed my audition and was moved up into a higher band for my senior year. SMASH developed my creativity, which has benefited me in school and music, and will continue to help me throughout my life."

Dionnie's submission:

"SMASH has transformed me into the person I am today. I started going to SMASH in 2008 starting 4th grade and it changed my whole way of learning, and I definitely appreciated that since I think I'm a different kind of learner... In the beginning I was scared to go to the new school because I wasn't sure I was going to fit in but I did, the teachers were amazing the way they always had your best interest at heart. Going to SMASH was an experience I would recommend to other people as well, knowing that you are in a safe community with caring teachers. There were two teachers that impacted my time at SMASH that I give so much thanks to, Genie and Kurt. Those are the teachers that pushed me to work to my best ability, and they never gave up on me. These teachers were amazing at their job and they made sure all of the kids were taken care of. I now realize from the teachers pushing me to work to my hardest ability that it helped me out a lot...I'd say SMASH helped me prepare for high school. "

Math

Core 7: We completed our 3D geometry unit test, reviewed order of operations, negative numbers and started our next unit, Data.

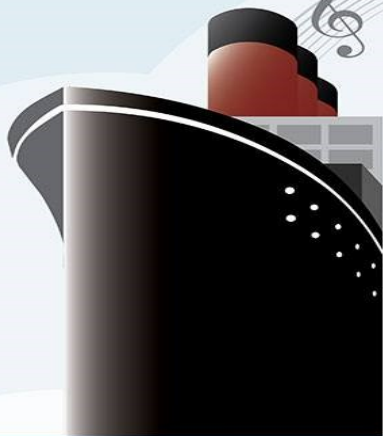
